<hr/> <p><b>Zillmer Local Ski Trip</b>  <i>Sunday, February 5, 1:00 pm</i></p> <p>Join the Nordics at 1:00 pm on Sunday, February 5 for a local ski outing at the Zillmer ski trails located in the Kettle Moraine State Forest - Northern Unit near Dundee, WI. The Zillmer Trail Area is one of the more popular cross-country ski trails in southeastern Wisconsin with 18.2 kilometers of trails in a stacked loop system. There are four named loop trails and all are groomed for both classic and skate. The scenery is a pleasant variety of oak and aspen forest, pine plantations, marsh, and open fields. The terrain consists of long flats, numerous rollers, and a couple of large hills. One of the trails also features a scenic overlook with expansive views of the surrounding area. A heated trail shelter is open for use.</p> <p>Directions: From the intersection of Highway 45 and Highway 67 north of Kewaskum, drive east on Highway 67 for 0.8 mile and turn south onto County Highway SS. Drive 1.8 miles on County SS to the Zillmer Trailhead parking lot entrance, on the north side of the road. A Wisconsin state park sticker is required for your vehicle.</p> <p>If there is not enough snow to ski at Zillmer, an email blast will be sent to club members several days before the outing detailing a different ski trail. ### **Fundraising Update: A Good Start to Helping XC Ski Groups Who Groom Trails for Us**

The Nordic Ski Club of Milwaukee (NSCM) raised \$180 in donations from its Keweenaw Peninsula ski trip participants. This New Year's ski trip was the start of our every-two-year fundraising project. The project continues over five months, on our three other bus trips and at monthly meetings.

NSCM is known for helping support cross-country ski venues up north, where we take busloads to ski. For example, we have supported Valley Spur Friends and its free youth ski rental in Hiawatha National Forest. We gave a grant to Swedetown Trails Club in the Keweenaw Peninsula to improve ski trails. We donated funds for a wood stove to Minocqua Winter Park in Wisconsin. These grants are in addition to supporting Milwaukee-area projects such as making snow at Lapham Peak State Forest.

Most cross-country ski venues are run by volunteer groups like us. Volunteers groom the ski trails, staff the lodges and run children's ski programs. To donate via mail, send a check made out to NSCM to treasurer Dave Herrewig, 9713 W. Debbie Lane, Milwaukee, WI 53224. Our goal is to raise \$800 to \$1,000. Some of that also will go to Milwaukee-area projects. Raising funds every two years is a decades-old tradition for NSCM. Let's continue to show support for other volunteers who maintain great outdoor places for us.

In 2022, in honor of NSCM's 50th anniversary, the club also decided to give grants of \$2,000 in October 2022 and \$3,000 in October 2023 to the new Lapham Peak Lodge.

there were very icy with some people opting to snow shoe or hike, while most skied and managed to stay upright in the challenging conditions. The bus driver didn't have such good luck as the bus got stuck in the parking lot and had to be pulled out while we were out skiing. To avoid the same fate in the parking lot when we left, Karen (our bus driver) picked us up on the road and we arrived at our hotel in Houghton, MI, The Quality Inn and Suites, where we were on our own for dinner.

On Saturday we skied at Michigan Tech where conditions were better, except for the lower NARA trails that hadn't been groomed recently. Unlike previous trips there, this time we had pleasant temperatures and no wind making for a nice day to be outdoors. MTU would be hosting the senior national X-C championships starting on Jan 1, so there were high school and college students from all over the country warming up and checking out the trail system. We met many of them in the waxing building that had a small lounge and they were quite friendly. The bus once again got stuck, this time in the upper parking lot at MTU so we had to walk a distance down to the road and over to a plowed parking lot when we got picked up after skiing. Everyone adjusted to the circumstances and helped carry skis and bags if someone needed help. For New Year's Eve we were again on our own for dinner, finding small groups of Nordics in various restaurants, though it's doubtful that any of us actually were up to watch the ball drop in Times Square to ring in 2023!

An interesting anecdote happened Saturday at the NARA trails in the chalet where there is a nice, big fireplace with lots of wood, but no matches or kindling. Using their ingenuity and a flint that David Rosenberg had in his emergency pack, plus some toilet paper soaked in hand sanitizer, John Pantazon was able to start a nice fire for the skiers waiting there. (No bruised hands from rubbing sticks together!)

Saturday night it snowed, giving us 2 inches of fresh powder for skiing the next day. About 2/3 of the group opted for the striding only trails at Maasto Hiihto and the delicious food prepared by the Friends group there. The rest of the group skied at Swedetown where conditions were excellent and we again had mild temperatures and no wind. During the drive from Maasto Hiihto to Swedetown we became aware that the GPS system on the bus was not necessarily to be trusted so eagle-eyed Nordics helped Karen find the correct way to go for parts of the rest of the trip. (And the bus did not get stuck again!)

We had our group dinner at Joey's Seafood on Sunday night with about 2/3 of the group enjoying the great food, drinks, and camaraderie. On both Saturday and Sunday Joy Chen offered yoga in the afternoon at the hotel. On Monday the whole group skied at Swedetown enjoying the excellent conditions and nice weather as well as the home made soups & pasties for sale for lunch. We made a quick food stop in Green Bay and arrived in Milwaukee around 9:00 pm.

There were a lot of challenges on this trip and Julie and Paul handled all of them with humor, patience, and efficiency. It also seemed to this writer that everyone on the trip was very accommodating, relaxed, helpful, and friendly. Perhaps it's because we've been through Covid and people's perspective about what matters has changed. Being able to get together again seemed to be reason enough to be patient and kind to each other. Join us on the next bus ski trip.
